


We have had an Olympian in our midst without even realising!


From the Chaplain

While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

Luke 24:36.

April has several special celebrations and holidays. We have Good Friday, Easter Sunday, and Anzac Day. Each one has its own remembrances and meaning for people. Anzac Day is very much a part of the cultural fabric of modern-day Australia and remembers the sacrifice on our behalf of our service men and women. Good Friday and Easter for many people mean a long weekend to gather with family or get away for a short holiday. For many families, since it also forms part of the school holidays it becomes an opportunity to get away to the coast or the mountains for a good break.





Associated with each of these special holidays are lots of customs and observances, such as the Anzac Day parades, Easter eggs and chocolate bunnies for Easter and hot cross buns for Good Friday. We can see lots of bunnies (not of the chocolate variety) around Tabeel already. It is interesting to read up on why bunnies (or hares) are associated with Easter, and what their symbolism may have been. But that is too big a topic for now!

Behind Good Friday and Easter is a story that is the very basis of Christian faith. It is the story of Jesus who dies on a cross on a Friday and rises from the dead on the Sunday. In his death, he brings healing and forgiveness to us, and in his resurrection on the Sunday he brings life and peace. The resurrection is such a foundational event for Christians that the Apostle Paul says in 1 Corinthians 15:17-19, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied." For Christians, if there is no resurrection of Jesus, then there is no resurrection for any of us and all we have is this life.

But then the Apostle Paul continues, "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep." Because of the resurrection we know that there is more to life than just what this world offers. We have hope and meaning for our lives, and the knowledge that there is a God who cares for us. We have the hope of a life beyond this world's life. The risen Jesus offers us his peace and joy.

As you enjoy all the customs and trappings of Easter – Easter eggs, chocolate bunnies, hot cross buns and family visits, may you also celebrate the story behind our celebrations (in the words of John 3:14-18a): "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned."

May you know the peace that Jesus brings, and may your days be filled with Resurrection joy! Grace and peace be yours always, Pastor Noel
